FLYING SCOT

We initially omitted the contact details for *Flying Scot 1957* reviewed in C L N 34:

Rab Wilson, poet and current 'Robert Burns Writing Fellow' for Dumfries and Galloway Arts Association (you don't get more Scots than that) has written an illustrated book of poems about his *Flying Scot 1957* which is the title of the book. It is a collaboration between Rab, the renowned Dumfries printer and artist Hugh Bryden, and Hugh's son, Ben Bryden, the international jazz musician, that celebrates and eulogises the famous 'Flying Scot' handmade bicycles that were once built and manufactured in Glasgow.

The work is a 'meeting' of jazz and poetry: the poems are printed in a highly collectable 'Art Book' with high quality lino-cut illustrations, and are packaged with two CDs; one with a reading of the poems, the other containing a suite of newly written and original jazz music which accompanies them. Hugh's books are really highly collectable art works in themselves; produced on the finest watermarked paper, hand stitched and beautifully presented and illustrated with his original lino-cuts.
